At this week's Board of Education meeting, we celebrated some remarkable achievements. We honored the Yonkers Montessori Academy Lady Eagles, who made history by winning the school's first-ever Sectional Championship in girls' basketball – breaking a 30-year citywide streak. We also recognized Saunders Trades and Technical High School students for their incredible bridge design projects that combined creativity with engineering. These moments remind us how talent and determination thrive here in Yonkers.

We also launched the first round of our School Math Problem Solving Competition, had students help shape next year's lunch menu during a food services tasting, and held our second Strategic Planning Committee meeting as we continue developing a roadmap for the future of our schools.


First Annual Math Competition Begins
