Sample Introductions and Thesis Statements

Throughout history, many countries and people have seen different levels of power and control. Power can be defined as the ability to influence or control the behavior of people and it is a part of every human interaction. Power can have a significant effect on civilizations because it has impacted a lot of people and has been an issue over time as seen in Hammurabi's Code (doc 1), the Ten Commandments (doc 2), and Divine Right (doc 3). Hammurabi's Code from Mesopotamia created divisions based on social classes. The Caste System discriminated against lower castes and untouchables. In modern day Islam, men are valued more than women.
