


Superintendent's Week In Review

Last year, Yonkers was designated a Model Community for Milestone 3, thanks to our exceptional graduation rates. This year, we're focused on Milestones 5 and 6, which emphasize employment and building a stronger workforce, as well as ensuring public safety. The ideas shared during this discussion were inspiring, and I look forward to putting them into action with our partners.

I also want to give special recognition to Alonzo Rose, a former safety officer at Roosevelt High School who became a Yonkers Police Officer yesterday.
