


Superintendent's Week In Review

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Message from Superintendent Soler

Dear Yonkers Public Schools Community,

I know that many families have concerns regarding the future of Museum School 25 and the broader financial challenges facing Yonkers Public Schools. Discussions about potential school closure and budget shortfalls are never easy, and I want to assure you that our priority remains providing the best possible education for all students.

As part of our ongoing efforts to right-size our schools, we are carefully evaluating grade configurations, enrollment trends, and our aging infrastructure to ensure that our district remains sustainable and that students have access to high-quality learning environments. Earlier this week, we met with staff and families to make them aware that the Board of Education will be considering the closure of Museum School 25 for the school year 2025 – 2026 at the February 26th meeting. As a new Superintendent, the last thing I want to do is propose a closing of a school, but the data shows that Museum School 25 has the lowest enrollment in the district, with only 12 families selecting it as their first choice this year, and the building itself requires over \$5.4 million in repairs.

While no final decision has been made, we are committed to working closely with families and staff to ensure a smooth transition should the Board of Education move forward with this plan. Should you have questions, we want to hear from you, reach out to my office at any time.

At the same time, we are continuing to improve our school choice process and need your input. With Yonkers Public Schools facing a \$68 million budget deficit difficult budgetary decisions may have to be made. That is why I encourage all families to complete the Yonkers Public Schools Community Survey – your feedback will help us make informed recommendations that reflect the priorities of our families and community. 


Fighting for Fair Funding




Students Celebrated the 100 Day Milestone


