Message from Superintendent Soler

Dear Yonkers Public Schools Community,

This week, our district faced a serious and concerning incident at Gorton High School, where a student was injured in a stabbing involving another student. The injured student is currently recovering and in stable condition, and the individual responsible has been arrested.



Superintendent Soler Addresses Students at Charles E. Gorton High School

<u>The safety and well-being of our students and staff remain our highest priority.</u> We are working closely with the Yonkers Police Department to review security measures and enhance our crisis intervention plan, including counselors, psychologists, mental health professionals and other school personnel. We are actively providing wrap around support services to students and staff affected by this incident. I want to assure you that we are taking every step to ensure the continued safety of our school communities. Just an important, I do not want this incident to overshadow the amazing work Gorton High School has done under the leadership of Principal Jaime Morales - achieving an over 90% graduation rate, building strong connections with staff and students, and leading an advanced healthcare magnet. Gorton High School has done amazing work and we should be proud.

Our district continues its mission to provide enriching opportunities and a supportive environment for all students. This weekend, I encourage families to attend the School Choice Expo, happening on Saturday from 9:30 AM to 1:00 PM. This event is a valuable opportunity to learn about the diverse programs available across Yonkers Public Schools and to prepare for the school choice application process, which opens in December. All of our campuses and central office staff will be onsite to assist families with making the best decision for their students. All families are welcome to attend especially if your child is new to our district, entering a transition grade such as 5th, 6th, or 8th, or considering a switch from their current school.

This week also included inspiring moments during my school visits to Dodson School, and Westchester Hills School 29. I was able to connect with students and staff and witness firsthand the dedication of leaders like Principal Romulo Ramirez, and Principal Steve Murphy, who are fostering positive learning environments. Our district continues to strengthen partnerships that expand opportunities for our students. I met with Manhattanville College President Dr. Frank Sanchez to discuss our shared vision for creating pathways to higher education. I look forward to working closely with the college to provide more opportunities for students.

I also met with Iona University to enhance our collaboration through the Liberty Partnerships Program. This initiative serves at-risk youth offering pre-collegiate support both during and after school.

School 23 Shines in the Mayor's School Spotlight!



Principal Walpole's Leadership Drives Success in Student Support, Community Engagement, and Achievement

This week, School 23 received special recognition in the Mayor's School Spotlight, highlighting the school's progress and achievements under Principal Walpole's leadership. Some initiatives contributing to School 23's success include:

- School Environment and Student Support: The Pupil Support Team focuses on restorative practices has led to minimal suspensions and enhanced support for students, resulting in an overall attendance increase to 91%, up by 3.5% from last year.
- Recognition and Community Engagement: School 23 has been recognized as a School in Good Standing by the New York State Education Department, a model Extended Learning Time School, and a leader in the Scholastic Literacy Pro Reading Challenge.
- Academic Achievement Growth: The school improved ELA proficiency by 11% and Math proficiency by 5% in the 2023-24 school year, with 67% of students in Grades K-8 advancing in i-Ready Math placements.

Board President Dr. Rosalba Corrado Del Vecchio and Superintendent Soler both praised the school's achievements, emphasizing that School 23 is a model of community involvement, and dedication to student success.
