

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Message from Superintendent Soler

Dear Yonkers Public Schools Community,

As we conclude our first official full week of the 2024-2025 school year, I want to reflect on the strong start we've had. I extend my deepest thanks to our families, students, educators, and staff for making this week so successful.

I look forward to all that we will accomplish together.



outdoor learning and activities.






Board of Education Workshop






Celebrating Hispanic Heritage
