Dissecting a Poem

- 1. <u>Title</u> What does it mean?
- 2. <u>Poet</u> Do you know anything about this person? Are you familiar with other poems by the same poet?
- 3. <u>Pictures</u> Are there any pictures on the page? What do they represent? Are they clues to the meaning of the poem?
- 4. Read the poem to yourself in a whisper level. Try to listen for the rhythm/beat of the words.
- 5. Circle Key Words in the poem while you read.
- 6. Ask yourself questions about the poem
 - a. Who/what is the **subject** of the poem?
 - b. Is the speaker a man, woman or something else?
 - c. What is the setting of the poem?
 - d. What is the intended audience for the poem?
 - e. What is the <u>tone/feel</u> of the poem? (sad, happy, inspirational)
 - f. What is the overall message of the poem?
- 7. Mark the **Rhyme Scheme** to the right of the poem.
- 8. Look for <u>Repetition</u> Try to figure out why lines are repeated.
- 9. Look for **poetic devices SHAMPOO** mark them on the paper.
