# **New York State Master Teacher Program**

<u>Purpose:</u> The purpose of the Master Teacher Program is to provide funds for Master Teacher Awards in order to attract highly qualified, experienced, expert teachers to teach in low-performing schools. Only districts with a building designated as SURR or low performing (Priority or Focus) are eligible. Teacher applicants for the award must be Nationally Board Certified and employed full-time in a low-performing public school. The initial annual award is \$10,000 and is renewable for two additional years. The maximum cumulative total of all awards is \$30,000. These funds are in addition to, and not a part of the teachers' base salary.

# **Eligible Applicants:**

Eligible school districts are those school districts with school buildings that have been designated by SED as SURR or low-performing schools. These districts may apply for funding for a master teacher to serve in those buildings.

Eligible Teachers are defined as those teachers who:

- Are Nationally Board Certified (determined by The National Board for Professional Teaching Standards) http://www.nbpts.org/
- Are employed full time at a SURR or low-performing public school
- Agree to serve up to three years (one year for each award) at the SURR or low-performing school in Yonkers Public Schools

## **Allowable Expenses:**

These funds must be used to provide stipends awarded to Designated Master Teachers serving in SURR or low-performing schools.

# Non-allowable Expenses:

Funds may **NOT** be used to pay fringe benefits or indirect or administrative costs on these awards.
