This reading comprehension packet is designed to help kids work toward the goals of carefully reading Level D text and thoughtfully answering textbased questions.

This packet includes eighteen passages and four text-based multiple choice questions for each passage. With each passage, there is also a written response page consisting of fill in the blank questions or sentence writing prompts. (A bonus passage about the American flag is also included.)

This resource supports the following Student Outcomes and related Common Core Standards:

- Students will ask and answer questions about key details in a text (RL.1.1 and RI.1.1).
- Students will read common high-frequency words by sight (RF.K.3c).
- Students will recognize and read grade-appropriate irregularly spelled words (RF.1.3g).
- Students will read with sufficient accuracy and fluency to support comprehension (RF.1.4).
- Students will read grade-level text with purpose and understanding (RF.1.4.A).

These passages are useful for small group work, choral reading, fluency work, intervention sessions, homework and literacy centers. I often have students go on "scavenger hunts" to find and highlight words with long vowels, words with specific endings, words from our word wall, etc.

Answering text-based questions early in the process of learning to read helps students learn to slow down and problem solve. Working through these activities, students frequently reread to find evidence to support their answers. As they do so, both their fluency and comprehension improve. Students learn to search for information in text, a skill that will benefit them throughout their school careers.
