

Experience what life was like in 1877, when the Trevor family moved into Glenview, the Museum's Gilded Age historic home on the National Register of Historic Places. # Explore the Earth with a Faraway Friend and Learn about the Andromeda Galaxy!



### New Installation of Works from HRM Collection, Featuring New Acquisitions and Old Favorites

See works from the HRM collection in a new light with a curated selection of modern and contemporary paintings, sculptures, and works on paper. Anchored by **George Segal**'s sculpture *Man Leaning Against a Wall of Doors* (1968), this new installation also features five of the seven Riverside panels of **Sylvia Sleigh**'s popular *Invitation to a Voyage: The Hudson River at Fishkill.* 

Don't miss HRM's new acquisitions, which include Federico Uribe's Black Rabbit (Gold Shells) (above right) and Green and Blue Bird (2020), which create beauty out of bullet shells.
