STUDENT ATTENDANCE

The State of New York requires every student to attend school every day unless he/she has a legal excuse.

If your child must stay home for an illness (fever or contagious virus) you must contact the main office by 9:00am to alert the school of their absence. In the event of an absence, a written excuse for the day(s) of absence(s) is required. The note must have the student's full name and should be signed and dated by a parent/guardian. In the event that your child is absent for 3 days, a written doctor's note should be submitted.

Early dismissal is not advisable. Any parent who must pick up their child before the end of the school day because of an emergency must call and alert the main office before 11:00a.m. and send in a written note.

DRESS CODE

To reinforce the continuation of a safe and secure environment for your child, all students are expected to dress in compliance with the Yonkers Code of Conduct.

Students are expected to be attired in accordance with the District Dress Code:

- 1. Students may not wear extremely revealing garments such as, tube tops, net tops, halter tops or see-through fabrics.
- 2. Undergarments must be completely covered with clothing. Pants and/or shorts are to be worn at the waist.
- 3. Footwear must be worn at all times. Footwear that is a safety hazard, such as but not limited to, flip-flops or sandals without a heel strap are not allowed.
- 4. Clothing which promotes inappropriate products or activities are prohibited.
- 5. Clothing will be considered inappropriate if it contains obscenities or denigrates others.
- 6. Headgear of any kind including, but not limited to, hats, caps, and hoods may not be worn in school, with the exception of headgear for religious or medical purposes.
- 7. Clothing generally accepted as "outer wear" may not be worn in the classroom.

CELL PHONE POLICY

Student possession and use of cell phones, portable video games, music players, smart watches, and other electronic devices is counter to our school's educational mission. Repeated studies have shown that cell phones distract students, lower their grades, increase bullying, and encourage theft. The cell phone policy is:

- Students in Pre-Kindergarten-3rd grade <u>may not bring</u> any cell phone or electronic device to school.
- Students in 4th grade and above who are bussed or dropped off and picked up at school should not bring any cell phone or electronic device to school.
- Students in 4th grade and above who walk to and from school may bring a cell phone to school. They may not bring any other electronic device. Any student with a cell phone must follow the policy below:
 - Cell phones must be powered off and placed in students' bags upon entry to the building.
 - Cell phones may not be used or displayed at any time during the school day.

Special Reminders for Parents:

- The school will at no time be responsible for students' personal property, including cell phones. Cell phones that are lost, damaged, or stolen at school are the exclusive responsibility of the student and their family.
- Parents/Guardians who need to reach students are to call the school's main office at (914)376-8570 to get in touch with their child if necessary, and particularly in an emergency.





ARRIVAL PROCEDURES PROCEDIMIENTOS DE LLEGADA

 Student's first day of school is September 5, 2024. It is important from the beginning of the school year to have a clear routine to get to school every day, ready, and on time.

<u>Arrival</u>

Students are required to be in their classrooms by 8:35am. Students who arrive after 8:40am must report to obtain a late pass. Classes begin promptly at 8:35am. Students will be allowed in the building at 8:20am if they participate in the breakfast program. All other students will enter through the courtyard door number 11 at 8:30am.



CAFETERIA PROCEDURES

All classes will have assigned tables. Students must:

- 1) Wait at the table until they are called for lunch.
- 2) Remain in their seats except when they are called up for lunch.
- 3) Refrain from throwing any food or making a mess at their table.
- 4) Students must clean their area and dispose of garbage.
- 5) Wait until each table is called for dismissal line up. Students will proceed to assigned area and will then be escorted out of the cafeteria.

Students are not permitted to leave the cafeteria without adult permission.

In order for all students to enjoy the full use and convenience of the cafeteria, these rules must be followed:

- a) Adults assigned to the cafeteria duty have total authority. Students, at the tables and in the lunch lines, are to follow adult directions.
- b) Food will be consumed during lunch periods ONLY. All students must eat lunch during their assigned lunch period in the cafeteria. Students should only be in the cafeteria during their assigned period.

GENERAL REMINDERS

- a) Students may bring lunch from home, if desired, but no outside delivery or restaurant food can be delivered or consumed.
- b) Courtesy and respect must be demonstrated to all cafeteria employees at all times.

DISMISSAL PROCEDURES

- The school adheres to a no dismissal policy between 2:45 p.m. and 3:00 p.m. If a student must be dismissed early it must be before 2:45 p.m. and the parents must have submitted a note prior to the early dismissal. It is understood that emergencies happen, and these situations will be handled by the main office staff and administration accordingly.
- All students must be dismissed by 3:15 p.m. Students who have not been picked up by 3:15 p.m. will be escorted to the main office and will need to be signed out from our late log book.

DISMISSAL BUS PROCEDURES

Bus children begin boarding buses at 3:10 p.m. Students in grades Pre-kindergarten through 6th will be picked up from their class and escorted to their bus. • We have informed parents that NO CHILD WILL BE CALLED AFTER 2:45 P.M. WE RESPECTFULLY REQUEST THAT PARENTS WAIT OUTSIDE. IF A STUDENT IS A BUS STUDENT, A WRITTEN NOTE FROM HIS/HER PARENT IS NEEDED ON DAY THEY ARE NOT TAKING THE BUS HOME. Teachers must provide all notes and letters to the main office for early dismissal before 10:00 a.m.

DISMISSAL - WALKERS

Students that walk home must provide the teacher with a note from the parent that states they allow their child to walk home. Walking notes should be submitted to the main office by September 30th. Only students in grades 4-6 can walk home with note from parent on emergency basis. Also, students <u>CANNOT</u> walk to the corner to meet their parents unless the parent provides a note.



Birthday Celebrations

- Birthdays are important to us but special occasions don't all need to be celebrated with food to be fun!
- All students birthdays will be celebrated with a building wide weekly announcement. Students will also be invited to wear a special badge or crown on their birthday if they choose.
- On the day of the child's birthday, parents are invited to:

 - Send in goodie bags with non perishable items for all students
 - Store bought cupcakes or cookies may be sent for consumption during the lunch period only
