




FALL	WINTER	SPRING
SAT: Take the SAT exam in October. Send scores to colleges from your College Board account.  Grades: If necessary, students may need to attend a fall credit recovery program.	College decisions and acceptances: Acceptance letters and financial aid offers will start to arrive. Review your acceptances, compare financial aid packages, and visit your final choices. Enter into Naviance and alert your School Counselor.	College Commitment Day: May 1 is typically the date when the college you plan to attend requires a commitment and deposit. When you've made your college decision, notify your counselor & enter it into Naviance. Send in your deposit by the postmark date of May 1.
College Fairs & Visits: Attend the YPS Districtwide College Fair & college open houses in the area.	Senior Projects/Internships: continue to work on any senior projects, internships, etc., if applicable.	Notify Colleges: notify any college which you decided not to attend, as well as their financial aid office if you were offered a financial aid package.
Financial Aid: FASFA opens 10/1. Complete CSS profile, if required.	<b>Mid-Year Grades</b> : Ask your counselor to send mid-year grades if requested by the college.	College acceptances and financial aid offers: hand copies to school counselor.
<b>Letters of Recommendation</b> : request from 1-2 of your teachers. Complete resumes & "brag sheets".	<b>Senioritis:</b> Don't slack in the classroom. Colleges can rescind acceptances if your grades drop.	Letters of Recommendation: it is good practice to give thank you letters to teachers that provided letters of recommendation.
Be mindful of deadlines: early action, early decision, priority, regular, rolling, etc. It is the students responsibility to submit applications before all deadlines.	Scholarships: research all scholarship opportunities and eligibility requirements. Use the Yonkers Public Schools Scholarship Book & Naviance Scholarship List.	Final transcript: request to be sent to the college you will be attending.  Follow up with your college: on financial aid and orientation.
Common Application: create account & start completing. Make sure your college essay has been properly edited.	Senior Projects/Internships: continue to work on any senior projects, internships, etc., if applicable.	<b>Graduation!</b> Congratulations & good luck!



# Reach

- Academically challenging you may not quite fit the college's academic profile
- Selective admissions
- Potentially high cost of attendance

# Target

- You are likely to be admitted based on your academic profile
- You would be happy attending that college
- Would not be financially overwhelming to attend

# Safety

- Schools where you are almost certain to be admitted
- You would be happy and get a good education there
- Affordable with reasonable effort





# NAMINATE & COMMONIAPP



# LINKING ACCOUNTS

- 1. Log into your Naviance account
- 2. Click on Colleges at the top of the page
- 3. Click on Colleges I'm Applying To in the drop down menu
- 4. In the blue box at the top of the screen click "match accounts"
- 5. Enter your login information for the Common Application
- 6. After entering your login information, your accounts should match and you should be redirected back to Naviance

# Once you submit your college application:

you must complete a pink form and submit it to Ms. Talone in guidance.

#### What is the PINK FORM:

a transcript request form. This signals to me that you have applied to a school and you're telling me where the transcript and other supporting documents need to be sent.

### How to submit the PINK FORM to Guidance:

Pink Forms cannot be emailed. They must be hand-written and submitted in person.



# **Student Responsibilities:**

It is the students' responsibility to complete the form and submit it in a timely manner.

#### Please meet deadlines

If the Pink Form is not submitted within the deadline, I cannot guarantee that your transcript and supporting documents will be sent to the school before the deadline.



# WHAT IS THE FAFSA?

The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) is an application that helps determine a students eligibility for financial aid.

- <u>Application</u>: You will be completing the 2025-2026 application, which is expected to be available on **December 1st**.
- **FSA ID**: Create your FSA ID now. Your parent will need to create one for themselves unless they already have one created for an older sibling's application.
- YONKERS FAFSA Day: Saturday, December 7
- TAP: is the state aid application for NYS residents applying to NYS colleges.
- <u>CSS Profile</u>: is a separate financial aid application in addition to FAFSA. It is used by certain colleges. It is the student's responsibility to determine whether or not they will need to complete that form.



- Student's FSA ID (visit <a href="https://fsaid.ed.gov/npas/index.htm">https://fsaid.ed.gov/npas/index.htm</a>)
- Parent's FSA ID Username & Password
- Parent's Full Name & Date of Birth
- Identification: Your Social Security card or number, driver's license, Alien Registration number, or Individual Taxpayer Identification Number (ITIN)
- Tax returns: Copies of your IRS 1040, 1040A, or 1040 EZ, W-2s, and 1099s
- Financial records: Current balances of cash, savings, and checking accounts, records of investments, businesses, and farms, and records of child support paid or received
- Demographic information: Your legal name as it appears on your Social Security card
- Schools: A list of up to 20 schools you're interested in attending

# Steps for Filling out a FAFSA

# Before Starting A FAFSA

## Get organized.

- Determine your dependency status...
- FAFSA on the web worksheet.
- Search for school codes.
- Students and parents apply for a PIN.
- Check application deadline dates.

# Filling Out A FAFSA

Fill out the application.

- Fill out your FAFSA.
- Open your saved FAFSA or correction application.
- Sign electronically with your PIN.

# FAFSA Follow-Up

View your results online.

- Check status of a submitted FAFSA or print signature page.
- Make corrections to a processed FAFSA.
- Add or delete a school code.
- View and print your student aid report.

# **FAFSA Tips For Parents**



#### Fill It Out

Many students and parents think that you must have difficult financial circumstances to qualify. Income plays a role, but it isn't the only one used to determine aid.



# Fill Out The Correct Form

Make sure to only use the official FAFSA form. All the documentation you need to use is found at fafsa.gov.



#### **Act Immediately**

Don't wait too long to fill things out. Many organizations that provide financial aid operate on a "first come, first serve" basis.



# Include All Schools Of Interest

When filling out the FAFSA's form, you'll notice it only allows for 10 schools of interest. If you're interested in more schools, don't worry. Submit them in batches instead.



#### **Don't Give Up**

According to the National College Access Network, 63% of high school students who complete the FAFSA are more likely to successfully attend college than those who don't file.




